



## About the Organization

We provide the tools to people experiencing homelessness so they have hope for a better life. This begins with a meal and shelter, and unfolds differently for each person seeking help. All guests have access to medical, dental, behavioral health, spiritual and career support while on campus.

Experiencing homelessness is traumatic. We get that. That's why we work to provide a safe and healing environment where the gospel of Christ is able to take hold of hearts and set them on a path of restoration. In that process, we offer personalized programs and coaching for men and women who are ready to commit to transformation. We work with these individuals to assist them with their goals—helping them move past their season of homelessness.

When a person comes to our Access Center and is seeking help, we connect them with a Case Manager who will talk with them to assess the next best step while with us. A Life Coach teams up with the person as an accountability partner in reaching individual goals. He or she embarks on a personalized Shelter Track or Residential Track. Both tracks give access to all services at Water Street and with our community partners. We provide :

- Counseling and case management
- Referrals to community services for financial, job, and housing needs.
- Recovery groups and parenting classes
- Devotions, chapel services and group prayer sessions
- Free dental care at Water Street Health Services
- Free medical and behavioral health support

## Internship Details

As an intern at Water Street, you would work in both the Access Center and Enrichment Center.

The Access Center is the “front desk” of the organization. It is the starting point for anyone who comes in seeking Water Street’s services. You would be responsible for assisting guests with intake paperwork and directing them to the necessary contacts.

The Enrichment Center is a computer lab that is available to guests. You would be responsible for assisting guests with any technology related needs, which range from checking emails to writing resumes and job applications. You would also be responsible for coordinating monthly classes for guests.

This position involves working with many guests who have experienced trauma, addiction, and poverty, and some who struggle with mental illness.
